

Walk Of The Month

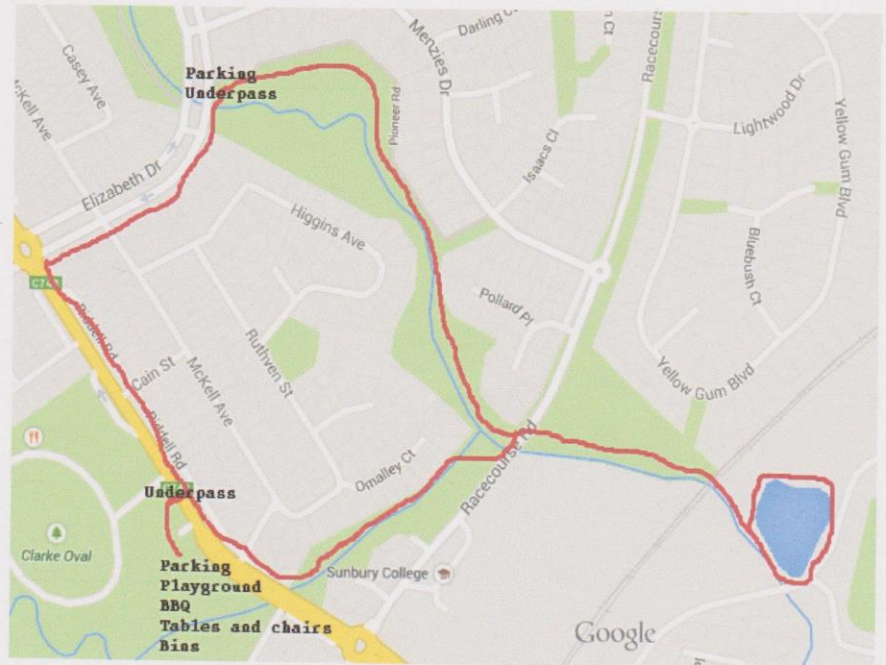
Kismet Creek/ Rupetswood Lake

This walk starts from the same place on Elizabeth Drive as the last walk (Spavin Lake), but following the path the other way.

This walk follows another part of Kismet creek from Elizabeth Drive to the lake at Rupetswood/ Salesian.

This walk showcases a wide variety of plants and birds, there are a few benches along the way to sit and watch them.

On the way back follow the creek again or walk up Riddle Road to Elizabeth Drive.



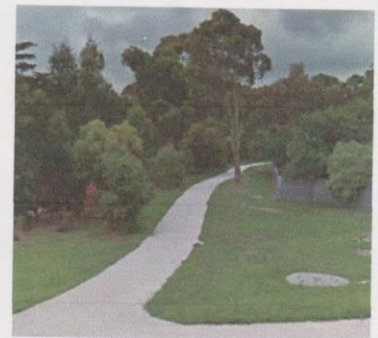
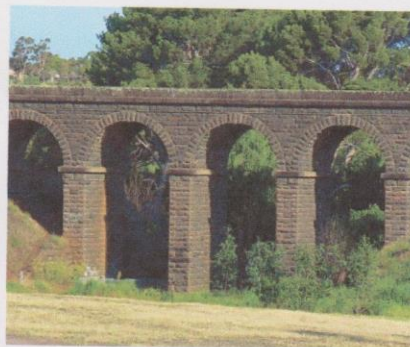
This is an easy walk since the council put in a new path meaning that you do not have to walk up a large hill which can be hard with a pusher or wheelchair.

There is an old blue stone rail bridge near Rupetswood lake, this rail bridge is still used by the Vline trains heading to Bendigo and it is worth the walk to see it.

Following the creek is a quiet and relaxing walk and the walk back along Riddle Road is made safer by the service road, so you do not have to walk near the main road which can be stressful for some dogs.

This walk can be added on to the Spavin Lake walk if you have a dog that loves walking and never gets tired. Or if you have two dogs (and two people) the dogs can be walked separately making a great bonding time for you and your dog.

You can stop at the playground near Clark Oval by going through the underpass. There are bins, tables, benches a playground, exercise equipment and BBQs.
